Working with Transgender Singers in the Choral Context

- 1. Working with transgender student is new for many in the field
 - a. Every choir is in a classroom, not just in a school setting
 - i. Community choirs, etc. are also places for advocacy and education and the conductors need to be leaders of these issues.
 - ii. Also being very open and understanding and being aware of the biases of members of the ensemble and address those feelings, etc.
 - b. What are some of the "scary aspects" for labels, etc.
 - i. Transgender
 - 1. A term for people whose gender identity, expression or behavior is different from those typically associated with their assigned sex at birth
 - ii. Cisgender / Non-transgender
 - 1. Gender identity, expression, or behavior align with those typically associated with their assigned sex at birth
 - iii. Ftm: Female to Male, then called Transgender Male
 - iv. MtF: Male to Female, then called Transgender Female
 - v. Gender Identity, Gender Expression and Transition
 - 1. Identity: internal sense of male, female or something else
 - 2. Expression: how person represents their gender identity (behavior, clothing, hairstyles, voice and body charactestics)

 - i. outdated, but good place to start
 - c. Divorces gender and sexuality
 - d. Trans community: Transition and then blend is the expectation so you don't risk job security, safety, etc.
 - i. Transpop.org: Survey system that will allow transgender to check their actual gender.
 - ii. 700,000 people in the US identifying as transgender
 - 1. New survey was just taken in 2015 with new report to come out in 2017.
 - e. Gender Unicorn
 - i. Identity, expression sex assigned at birth, physically attracted to? Emotionally attracted to?
 - ii. Good starting entrance to discussion
 - f. Your gender identity and how you express it are two different things.
 - i. Men do it this way and women do it that way.
 - 1. How does that apply to your ensemble
 - a. Performance attire
 - b. Make-up
 - c. Voicing
 - g. Medical School (UW) now has a transgender-focused class that talks about medically treating transgender patients.
 - h. Transgender is being focused on right now for non-discrimination laws, especially since the marriage equality ruling.
 - i. 41% of all transgender have attempted suicide
 - i. This is an alarming statistic and one that needs to be shared to show that it is almost 1 out of 2 transgender people.
 - j. Lower yearly salary very common (by approximately \$10,000)
 - k. Health care restrictions in many states
 - i. Transition related health care needs: only 9 states cover it
 - ii. Surgeries are still over \$20,000 \$30,000 even with some health benefits
- 2. Case Study of Melanie
 - a. Awareness of words that are used in rehearsal (men / women vs. sopranos / altos)
 - i. Men start at measure....., etc.
 - ii. Gender binary in the choral rehearsal is an issue
 - b. Voice change can be a time when transgender students start to feel these things because being a soprano felt comfortable and then the change to the male voice can be a jolt if they still relate more as a female if male.

c. Voice and Mannerism

i. inflection and speaking voice will map very feminine.ii. Pitch is not a huge difference, it is more inflection and changes at the end of the phrase.
